Various state mandated testing will be administered to students at Mandeville Junior High in the second semester. All tests are computer based except for the Science LEAP Connect. End-of-Course (EOC)	Students enrolled in Algebra I	May 14	High school students take End-of-Course tests in six subjects: Algebra I, Geometry, English II and III, Biology and U.S. History. Students at Mandeville Junior who are enrolled in any of the above courses, are required to take the EOC for the course(s) in which they are enrolled.	Students receive their scores in the mail. The results for the End of Course Test will count for the final exam and 20% of the fourth quarterly grade. Students meeting the criteria to receive Carnegie credit at the junior high school shall receive a letter grade to be placed on their high school transcripts. To earn a standard high school diploma, students must earn a score of Fair or above on three End-of-Course tests, including one in each category– Algebra I or Geometry, English II or English III, and Biology or U.S. History.
